St. Mary's became the first parochial elementary school in the Diocese of Memphis to receive the accreditation of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Council on Accreditation and School Improvement (SACS CASI).

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Activities center, gym and additional grades

Growth in the early 1980's prompted several additions and in 1983 the Parish added an activities center and a gym to the school. By 1990, grades 7 and 8 were added. Continued growth necessitated a major expansion as the doubling of each grade occurred over the next 8 years.

Religion

Daily Religion class is taught at all grade levels. The Catholic faith is taught through our religion texts, a weekly school Rosary and Mass twice a week. Students are immersed in daily prayer, Sacred Scripture, and in developing their life as followers of Jesus Christ.



Language

Latin is taught each day in Grades 2-8 with an emphasis on Latin grammar. These grammatical skills are used across most subject areas and help students to master English grammar while building a foundation for other foreign languages. Conversational Spanish is also taught on a weekly basis in grades K-8.



Reading and Literature

Our students study meaningful classical literature throughout all grade levels. Students read, analyze and enjoy a variety of selections throughout the year. Grades 3-8 spend more time on indepth studies of selected books that help build comprehension, vocabulary and questioning skills. Each novel is intended to inspire and nurture our students so that they become vigorous readers.



Phonics and Spelling

Phonics and Spelling are taught on a daily basis in our primary grades. Our approach is based on a mastery of letter recognition and sounds. Daily practice is provided for our students to help them develop word recognition and reading skills.



English and Composition

English Grammar Recitation and Classical Composition are taught in grades 3-8. Students learn how to examine and discuss literature and poetry and express themselves with accuracy, transparency and distinctiveness through their own writing. Our program teaches students the art of communication in a logical, organized approach as they learn to refine and master their writing skills.



Handwriting

Penmanship is taught on a daily basis in our lower grades. Cursive begins in first grade and is taught systematically through grade five.



Math

Our lower grade math program provides a solid and ample foundation in arithmetic and algebraic readiness. We offer a coherent, logical approach that emphasizes mastery. Pre-Algebra is taught in grade seven and Algebra 1 in grade eight.



Science

We offer a hands-on science program with daily investigations, group work, detailed lab notebooks and an outdoor component with each unit of study. Our students study each topic in depth and are expected to use their math and writing skills with each inquiry.



Our social studies curriculum includes a comprehensive study of the United States, the origins of world cultures and the influence of Christianity on Western Civilization. Our map skills and geography studies are expansive as each region is explored in its historical context.

Technology

Technology will play an increasingly important role in your child's life and education. At St. Mary's, we are continually integrating technology into our curriculum and classroom instruction.

Preschool

Children learn primarily through play and meaningful experiences; therefore, St. Mary's Preschool combines structured activities with free exploration of learning centers, throughout the room. Daily whole group instruction includes phonics, math, religion, handwriting, literature, Spanish, & sign language. Enrichment classes include Music, Library, and P.E. Preschool classes are offered 5 or 3 days a week







Fine Arts The Fine Arts program at St. Mary's School excels with music and art classes. Students in all grades participate in music and art classes and have opportunities to highlight their creativity in fun and exciting ways.



Sacred Heart of Jesus High School was established in 2004 as a private, Catholic, college preparatory high school and is part of the nearly 140 year Catholic school heritage of Jackson. The foundation for the school was the conviction that the truth can be known, and that Christ is the truth from whom all other truths flow. The school is fully accredited through the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and is a member of the National Catholic Educational Association and the National Association of Private Catholic Independent Schools.

By opening to them the treasury of human knowledge, teachers strive to inspire students with an ardent love of truth. By teaching students to think not only critically but classically, and to integrate that thought into their own actions, a Sacred Heart of Jesus education prepares students to face the concrete conditions of the world and to embrace Christian truths.

"From the student art work and photographs that line the hallways to the interactions among the teachers and students in classrooms, the genuine concern for the well-being of the total child is evident and directly reflective of the school's mission and vision" (SACS External Review Report, 2014).

SHJHS has a vibrant Catholic atmosphere faithful to the Church's Magisterium and a rigorous curriculum where students learn:

- Classical and Ecclesiastical Latin
- Spanish
- Chemistry, Biology and Anatomy and Physiology
- Classical and Modern Literature
- English Composition
- Research Methods
- Algebra, Geometry, Trigonometry, Calculus and Physics
- Catholic Theology

- Technology through research, writing integration and multi-media design
- · Rhetoric, Logic and Critical thinking
- Virtues and good sportsmanship

The Sacred Heart of Jesus curriculum is designed to provide an outstanding foundation in the critical academic disciplines of math, science, history, literature, composition and language, crowned by regular study of and growth in the Faith. The school's approach to learning includes in-depth study of the great works of the western world and of Christendom.

Sacred Heart student consistently score 20 percent higher on the ACT Test than the average composite score for all students in Tennessee. In addition, Sacred Heart of Jesus High School has recently been ranked in the top 20 private high schools in the state of Tennessee by an independent national review.



These courses are structured by the College Entrance Examination Board (CEEB). Teachers and students operate in these classes on the assumption that many juniors and seniors can complete college level coursework in high school.

Dual Enrollment Courses:

Dual Enrollment classes meet on the Sacred Heart campus and is taught by college professors. An agreement is entered into with an accredited 4 year University based on student needs.

Athletics

Religious Life



The intellectual tradition and moral teachings of the Catholic Church infuse the whole life of Sacred Heart of Jesus High School, illuminating all learning as well as the community within which learning takes place. The curriculum is ordered toward theology — that is, the knowledge of God — and the school strives in all things to remain faithful to the Magisterium of the Catholic Church.

At SHJHS, students learn the Faith both inside the classroom and out. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is held twice each week in the school chapel and students have the opportunity to frequent the sacrament of confession

twice each month. Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, the Rosary, student retreats and service days are regular occurrences. Every school event, whether a dance or a basketball game, is planned with an eye toward deepening the faith and nurturing virtue. Each activity, as with each class, begins with a prayer.

College Planning

SHJHS students have a 100% college acceptance rate and exceed the national, state, and local averages on the ACT. Students have been admitted to a wide range of colleges, including local and state schools, as well as nationally ranked universities.

The college advising process is weaved throughout the curriculum. Students apply their skills from the classroom to build their resumes and enrich their essays. Individual meetings, small group meetings and senior seminars are used to offer guidance in the application process.

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
